

THE DEEP END: Shalom

The disciples in today's Gospel must have been so excited to tell Thomas their news: 'We have seen the Lord'. Sometimes, when we try to share something of our faith experience with others, we can meet similar responses - doubting, cynicism we can even be made fun of. The Risen Jesus bears the wounds of his suffering and even invites Thomas to touch them, to get in touch with the reality of his suffering. We might recall times when we have been overwhelmed by pain but looking back on those times we can see that they sometimes brought us to a different place, to new life. Perhaps today recall those times of 'wounded-ness' - and hear Jesus's 'Peace be with you', the promise that he is with you. The word 'Peace' (Shalom) is more than a wish for a good evening or peaceful day. It expresses the desire that the person receiving the blessing might be whole in body, mind and spirit. The Risen Jesus brings a peace that is life-giving. The disciples were locked away, afraid, closed off from the world. When Jesus is present with them, their hearts are opened again, they rejoice. The Risen Jesus in today's Gospel moves the disciples from total fear and despair to 'rejoicing'. The same Risen Jesus is active in all our lives and in the world around us.

St Munchin's College.

Tuesday April 25th Lay Led Liturgy in all Parishes This Liturgy will take place in St Munchin's College at 9.45am.

Every parish in Limerick Diocese has been asked to host a lay led liturgy. Formation and resources have been offered to all parishes, so that everyone is included.

What type of prayer or liturgy will this be? Parishes have been asked to offer a Liturgy of the Word, in which we are nourished at the Table of the Word. The Word of God in Scripture will feed us as we bring our lives and our prayers to God together on this morning. There will not be a Communion Service as part of this liturgy for two reasons. Firstly we respect our Bishops request, and we respect other parishes by celebrating in unity. Secondly, the reception of Holy Communion should normally be part of the full celebration of the Eucharist. It is a long-held tradition that Communion can be brought to the sick. For a wide variety of

reasons, pubic prayer with the distribution of Communion is normally reserved to particular circumstances such as on Sundays when parishes cannot celebrate the Eucharist, and in nursing homes etc. April 25th is a one day event, but is part of our on-going commitment to support good Liturgies in strong local communities.
