## Tuesday 30th May 2017 Feast Day of Joan of Arc

Joan of Arc, a peasant girl living in medieval France, believed that God had chosen her to lead France to victory in its long-running war with England. With no military training,



Joan convinced the embattled crown prince Charles of Valois to allow her to lead a French army to

the besieged city of Orléans, where it achieved a momentous victory over the English and their French allies, the Burgundians. After seeing the prince crowned

King Charles VII, Joan was captured by Anglo-Burgundian forces, tried for witchcraft and heresy and burned at the stake in 1431, at the age of 19. By the time she was officially canonized in 1920, the Maid of Orléans (as she was known) had long been considered one of history's greatest saints, and an enduring symbol of French unity and nationalism.

Where Are All The Irish Female Playwrights? A conference in Mary immaculate college to shine the light on Irish Women Playwrights and

Theatremakers. When the Abbey

Theatre announced its



1916 centenary "Waking the Nation" programme, Irish theatre fans and practitioners were rightly outraged that only one of the ten plays being produced was written by a woman. The outcry over that genderimbalanced programme led numerous Irish women to take to social media and vent their justified anger. The "Waking the Feminists" (WTF) initiative was born, and this important grassroots movement has done much to highlight the prejudice regularly endured by women working in Irish theatre, yesterday and today.
