The compass is an instrument used by explorers on land and on sea to navigate their position and to chart their journey. He was considered a patron of shipping and held in high regard by sailors, as is depicted so beautifully in our stained-glass window.

The compass holds meaning for all travellers, being a symbol for guidance, the ability to point you in the right direction
