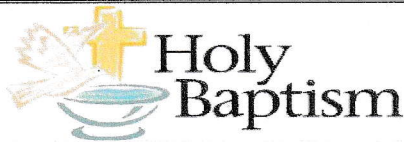

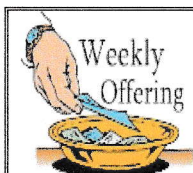

Fasting during the period of Lent is seen as a time of spiritual renewal. The 40-day journey is an opportunity to grow more deeply in love of God and our neighbour. It is a time to re-focus on what really matters in life.

Fasting can involve avoiding negative habits;

Fasting from judging others; see Jesus Christ who lives in them.

Fast from hurtful words; replace them with kindness.

Fast from cynicism; express gratitude.

Fast from anger; express patience.

Fast from pessimism; keep the light of hope on.

Fast from preoccupations; occupy yourself trusting in God.

Fast from complaining; fill yourself with appreciating what surrounds you.

Fast from bitterness; fill yourself with forgiveness.

Fast from grudges; seek reconciliation.
