New Year Message

We hope you had an enjoyable time over Christmas with family and friends. Now as we greet 2026, while we cannot foresee what this New Year will bring, but we can live each day knowing that God is our loving Father, that His Son has saved us, and that He has given us His Holy Spirit to dwell in our hearts. We can live each day also knowing that Mary, the mother of God, is also our mother, the mother of the Church, who intercedes for us with her Son.

As we begin this New Year, we, the priests of your parish, pray for you and all your families and loved ones. May the Lord Bless you, and Keep you Safe in 2026

Feast of the Epiphany Tuesday 6th January Holy day of Obligation Mass in St Mary's Church at 10.00am

The Epiphany celebrates the revelation that Jesus is the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Three Wise Men, but it also focuses on his baptism in the Jordan and at the wedding at Cana. In the Eastern rites of the Catholic Church, Theophany – as Epiphany is known in the East – commemorates the manifestation of Jesus' divinity at his baptism in the River Jordan. However, the meaning of the feast goes deeper than just the bringing of presents or the end of Christmas: "You can't understand the Nativity without Theophany: or you can't understand Nativity without Epiphany." The revelation of Christ as the Son of God - both as an infant and at his baptism - illuminate the mysteries of the Christmas season. Our human nature is blinded because of sin, and we're unable to see as God sees. God reveals to us the revelation of what's going on." The gifts the Wise Men brought – frankincense, myrrh, and gold - as gifts that point not only to Christ's divinity and his revelation to the Magi as the King of Kings but also to his crucifixion. In giving herbs traditionally used for burial, these gifts bring a theological "shadow, a sense of anticipation of what is to come." Certain traditions have arisen around the feast, here in Ireland, it is also known as Women's Christmas (Nollaig na mBan) where women rest from housework and cleaning and celebrate together with a special meal.
